REGISTRATION

Activity/Team Fees, Refunds & Cancellations

- Activity cancellations will be accepted up to five business days prior to start of activity, unless otherwise stated.
- A \$5.00 processing fee will be applied on cancellations.
- Team fees are non-refundable.
- If a PRCE activity is cancelled, a full refund will be processed.
- Refunds will not be available if an activity has started except for medical reasons.

Recreation Center, Campground & Shelter Facilities

- Recreation Center cancellations need to be made within five business days of reservation date. A \$5.00 processing fee for every \$50 purchase will apply.

Tots: Proper way to fall/get up, marching while standing & moving, 2-ft jump, forward swizzles, 2 ft glide, push & glide stroking, dips & more!

Pre-Alpha: 2 ft glide, 1 ft glide (both feet), Backward wiggle & Backward swizzle

Alpha: Forward stroking, Snowplow stop, Forward crossovers (each foot)

Beta: Backward stroking, Backward crossovers (each foot), T-stops (each foot)

Gamma: Outside 3-turns (each foot), Hockey stop, Inside Open Mohawk Combination (each foot)

Delta: Forward inside 3-turns (each foot), Edges (outside & inside each foot), Shoot-the-duck or Lunge, Bunny hop

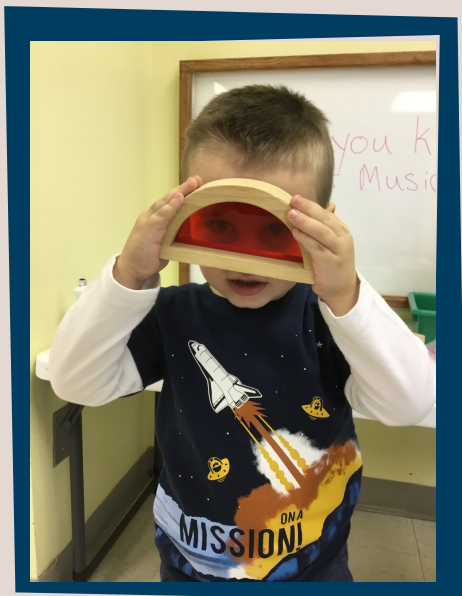

Complete 30 hours of classroom education.

- Your teen will be issued a certificate of completion (blue card) proving the coursework has been completed.
- Make an appointment at a Minnesota DMV testing center to take the written knowledge test to receive the learner's permit.
- You must present the blue card when taking the test.
- Complete 6 hours of behind-the-wheel instruction with a licensed instructor.
- Your teen will be issued a certificate of completion (white card) proving the behind-the-wheel instruction was completed.
- Complete the Supervised Driving Log.
- Your teen must log 50 hours of supervised driving with a licensed driver over the age of 21 (typically the parents).
- Make an appointment at a Minnesota DMV testing center to take the road test.
- Your teen must be 16 years old and have held their instruction permit for a minimum of 6 months.
- You must present the white card and Supervised Driving Log when taking the test.

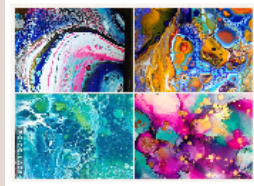

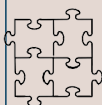

Snow Emergency Information

A snow emergency may include significant snow fall of more than 4", severe drifting and/or freezing rain. City officials will declare a snow emergency by 4:00 p.m. Snow emergencies start at 12:00 midnight and end at 7:00 a.m. During this time there is no parking allowed on streets and alleyways. A follow-up snow emergency may be declared, depending on conditions, so be sure to check to see if snow emergencies are in effect on consecutive days. During a snow emergency, police officers are authorized to have a motor vehicle parked in violation of the ordinance removed at the owner's expense. If you are unsure, regularly park vehicles in locations other than on the street before and during snow events until all streets are fully plowed.

Existing, posted parking restrictions remain in effect and will be enforced.

How can a person find out about a snow emergency?

- Call 234-5699 any time to see if a snow emergency is in effect.
- Consult local media (KDUZ/KARP, Hutchinson Leader website, HCVN)
- Sign up for everbridge® service by logging onto the City's website: www.ci.hutchinson.mn.us, and clicking on the "Emergency Notifications" tab,. Follow the instructions for signing up to receive notification of a snow emergency and other City services via telephone, email or mobile device.

Please DO NOT rake leaves into the street until the day of your garbage service.

LEAVES ONLY -

To make sure the equipment stays running, please don't rake anything other than leaves onto street curbs.

Residential services are provided by tractor drawn vacuums, so please leave room for cornering. Leaves will be vacuumed from your street the day after your recycling & garbage is picked up.

Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)

The EAB is an insect that kills ash trees. EAB is now present in almost every county around McLeod county but hasn't been found yet in Hutchinson. We are currently managing our ash tree population anticipating its arrival at some point in the future.

Currently, about 15% of publicly owned trees are susceptible to EAB. In recognition of this, the City has set aside some funds for ash tree removal and replacement. This program provides for removal and replacement of ash trees to maintain our tree lined boulevards, preserving for our generation, and future generations, the numerous benefits of having a well developed tree canopy in our community.

If an ash tree on the boulevard near your home is declining in health, we invite you to contact us to let us know about it. We will be putting these trees on a list and will likely be able to remove and replace upwards of 50 trees per year. Before being removed and replaced, an evaluation of the tree's health will be conducted, along with determining the proximity of the tree to others being removed. This is done to avoid having too many trees removed and replaced in any one neighborhood.

Stump removal

We try to have stumps of trees removed in a calendar year removed by at least the fall of the same calendar year. If you have a stump from a removed tree on the boulevard several months old, feel free to let us know.

New Home Boulevard Planting

Forestry staff will be planting trees on new home boulevards through our development program this fall. If you have a recently built home with no boulevard trees and have not been contacted, please call or email us.
